International Council of Fine Arts Deans Endowment for Student International Travel

The International Council of Fine Arts Deans Endowment for Student International Travel has been established to encourage progress and to provide assistance to student in financing their education at Wayne State University.

Eligibility:

1. All currently enrolled undergraduate students with majors in the College of Fine, Performing and Communication Arts who are in good academic standing may apply for grants from the fund.
2. Although funding will be considered for any legitimate educational purpose, preference will be given to students who are enrolled in a recognized study abroad program or who have been selected as a participant in an international professional conference, exhibition or competition in their field of study.
3. Students must be enrolled during the period covered by the requested funding.
4. Individual students may be granted funds only once per full academic year.

Application Procedure: Submit a letter in which you include:

- a. your major
- b. your student ID (nine digit number)
- c. your academic standing
- d. the educational activity for which you are requesting funding
- e. a budget breakdown by expected expenditures (travel, lodging, per diem, program fees, etc.), including personal funds and funds requested or committed from other sources
- f. as an attachment to your letter, a printout of your WSU transcript (available through Academica)

The letter may be submitted during the Fall or Winter terms and should be addressed to:

Funding Available: One grant per semester will be awarded in the range of \$300, and it is expected that students will contribute part of the projected expenses from personal funds. Grants will be disbursed through Financial Aid.

Deadline: February 1

Letters of request will be reviewed in the CFPCA Scholarship Committee.
